1.0 SCOPE. This document contains requirements to restore the Light Armored Vehicle-25 Strut, Right to Condition Code "A." Condition Code "A" is defined as serviceable/issuable without qualification, new, used, repaired, or reconditioned material which is serviceable and issuable to all customers without limitation or restriction.

1.1 This Statement of Work (SOW) identifies the work effort that shall be performed by the contractor (for the purposes of this SOW, contractor is defined as the commercial or government entity performing the repair) to repair the Strut, Right, NSN 2510-21-908-3070 in support of the Light Armored Vehicle, ID# 08594A, TAMCN E0947, NSN 2320-01-123-1602.

3.0 REQUIREMENTS

3.1 GENERAL TASKS. The contractor shall repair the Strut Assembly in accordance with TM 08594A-34/9, pages 5-2 through 5-31, and the Engineering Process Instruction (EPI) of the Marine Corps Logistics Bases Albany Repair Facility for the Strut Assembly.

3.1.1 Government Furnished Equipment (GFE)/Government Furnished Materiel (GFM). GFE is government owned equipment authorized by contract for use by a commercial/ Government contractor. It is neither consumed during production nor incorporated into any product. GFM is materiel furnished to a contractor that will be consumed during the course of production or incorporated into the product being manufactured/ remanufactured under a contract/statement of work. In the event the Marine Corps does have GFE/GFM requirements the Management Control Activity (MCA/G316-2), Marine Corps Logistics Bases, Albany, Georgia, will coordinate required GFE and will maintain a central control on Marine Corps assets in the Contractor's possession. The MCA will forward a GFE Accountability agreement to the Contractor Facility for signature to establish a chain of custody and property responsibilities for Marine Corps assets.

3.1.2 Contractor Furnished Materiel (CFM). The Marine Corps has adopted the Navy's procedures regarding Contractor Furnished Materiel (NAVICPINST 4491.2A). In the event that Contractor Furnished Materiel (CFM) is required for repair parts, the contractor shall requisition repair parts through the DoD Supply System. DoD 4000.25-1-M (MILSTRIP), Chapter 11 authorizes contractors to requisition through the DoD Supply System.

3.2 QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS. The contractor shall provide and maintain a Quality System that as a minimum, adheres to the requirements of ANSI/ISO/ASQC/Q9003-1994 Quality Systems Model for Quality Assurance in Final Inspection and Test.

3.3 CONFIGURATION CONTROL. If it is necessary to depart from the authorized Bill of Material, the contractor shall submit a Request for Deviation or Request for Waiver using MIL-STD-973, paragraph 5.4.3 or 5.4.4 as guidance.

3.4 PACKAGING, HANDLING, STORAGE AND TRANSPORTATION (PHS&T)

a. The Contractor shall be responsible for preservation and packaging of items being repaired under the terms of this statement of work in accordance with MIL-STD-2073-1C, Method 10. Items scheduled for long term storage or shipment to overseas destinations shall be packaged in accordance with Level A requirements. Items scheduled for domestic shipment and short-term storage shall be packaged in accordance with Level B requirements.

b. Marking shall be in accordance with MIL-STD-129.

c. The Marine Corps will provide the contractor with the shipping address(es) for delivery of the repaired equipment. The contractor shall be responsible for arranging for shipment to the pre-designated site(s). The Marine Corps will be responsible for transportation costs associated with shipping the subject equipment to and from the Contractor.
