

STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW)
REBUILD OF
SHAFT ASSEMBLY
TRAVERSING
NSN 1025-01-061-7078

1.0 Scope

This document contains requirements to restore the Shaft Assembly Traversing for the M198 Howitzer, to condition code 'A.' Condition code 'A' is defined as serviceable/issuable without qualification, new, used, repaired, or reconditioned material which is serviceable and issuable to all customers without limitation or restriction.

1.1 This Statement of Work (SOW) identifies the work effort that shall be performed by the contractor to rebuild the Shaft Assembly Traversing NSN 1025-01-061-7078 in support of the M198 Howitzer, ID# 08198A, TAMCN E0665, NSN 1025-01-026-6648.

3.0 Requirements

3.1 Rebuild

The contractor shall rebuild the Shaft Assembly Traversing in accordance with DMWR 9-1025-211-2, Chapter 4.

3.2 Quality Assurance/Quality Control

The contractor shall provide and maintain a Quality System that as a minimum, adheres to the requirements of ANSI/ISO/ASQC Q9002-1994, Quality System Model for Quality Assurance in Production, Installation, and Servicing.

Quality acceptance and test procedures shall be in accordance with DMWR 9-1025-211-2, chapter 5.

3.3 Configuration Control

If it is necessary to depart from the DMWR's authorized Bill of Material, the Contractor shall submit a Request for Deviation/Request for Waiver using MIL-STD-973, paragraph 5.4.3 and 5.4.4 as guidance.

3.4 Packaging Handling Storage and Transportation

a. The contractor shall be responsible for preservation and packaging of items being rebuilt under the terms of this statement of work. Preservation and packaging of items shall be Level "A" in accordance with Special Packagin Instruction (SPI) P12008225 which may be obtained from Commander, Code (G330), 814 Radford Blvd., Marine Corps Logistics Bases, Albany, Georgia 31704-1128, Commercial (912) 439-6856, DSN 567-6856.

b. Marking shall be in accordance with MIL-STD-129.

c. The Marine Corps will provide the contractor with the shipping address(es) for delivery of the rebuild equipment, and the contractor shall be responsible for arranging for shipment to the pre-designated site. The Marine Corps iwll be responsible for transportation costs associated with shipping the subject equipment to and from the Contractor.

3.5 Government Furnished Equipment or Government Furnished Materiel

GFE is government owned equipment authorized by contract for use by a commercial/ Government contractor. It is neither consumed during production nor incorporated into any product. GFM is materiel furnished to a contractor that will be consumed during the course of production or incorporated into the product being manufactured/remanufactured under a contract/statement of work. In the event the Marine Corps does have GFE/GFM requirements, the Management Control Activity (MCA), Marine Corps Logistics Bases, Albany, Georgia, (G316-2), will coordinate required GFE and will maintain a central control system on Marine Corps assets in the Contractor's possession. The MCA will forward a GFE Accountability Agreement to the Contractor for signature to establish a chain of custody and property responsibilities for the Marine Corps assets.

3.6 Contractor Furnished Materiel

In the event that Contractor Furnished Materiel is required for repair parts, the DOD 4000.25-1-M (MILSTRIP) Chapter 11 authorizes contractors to requisition through the DOD Supply System. The Marine Corps has adopted the Navy's procedures regarding Contractor Furnished Materiel (NAVICPINST 4491.2A). This would require specific provisions in section H of the contract to place total responsibility on the contractor to obtain direct electronic access to the DOD supply System electronically submit their requisitions, maintain status, receive billing from the source of supply and provide direct payment to DFAS.
