

STATEMENT OF WORK FOR THE
Rebuild of the CIRCUIT CARD ASSEMBLY, REGULATOR
For the SB-3614(V)/TT
NSN: 5998-01-059-2420

1.0 Scope. This Statement of Work (SOW) establishes, sets forth tasks and identifies the work efforts that shall be performed by the Contractor (for purposes of this SOW, Contractor is defined as the commercial or government entity performing the rebuild) to rebuild the Regulator Circuit Card Assembly, NSN 5998-01-059-2420, Part Number 755090A0710-1, CAGE 87990. This document contains requirements to restore the Regulator Circuit Card Assembly to Condition Code "A". Condition Code "A" is defined as "serviceable/issuable without qualification, new, used, repaired or reconditioned materiel which is serviceable and issuable to all customers without limitation or restriction, including materiel with more than six months shelf-life remaining".

1.1 Background. Rebuild is defined as "That maintenance technique to restore an item to a standard as near as possible to original or new condition in appearance, performance, and life expectancy. This is accomplished through a maintenance technique or complete disassembly of the item, inspection of all parts or components, repairs or replacement of worn or unserviceable elements using original manufacturing tolerances and/or specifications and subsequent reassembly of the items."

2.0 Applicable Documents. The following documents form a part of this SOW to the extent specified. Unless otherwise specified, the issues of these documents are those listed in the DoD Index of Specifications and Standards (DoDISS) and supplement thereto which is in effect on the date of solicitation. In the event of conflict between the documents referenced herein and the contents of this SOW, the contents of this SOW shall be the superseding requirement.

3.0 Requirements

3.1 General Task. The Contractor shall rebuild the Regulator Circuit Card Assembly, NSN 5998-01-059-2420, Part Number 755090A0710-1, CAGE 87990 in accordance with DMWR 11-5805-695, Engineering Drawing 755090A0710 and Parts List 755090A0710, CAGE 87990.

3.2 Packaging, Handling, Storage and Transportation (PHS&T)

a. The Contractor shall be responsible for preservation and packaging of item(s) being rebuilt under the terms of this statement of work. Items scheduled for long-term storage or shipment to overseas destinations shall be in accordance with level “A” requirements of MIL-STD-2073-1D, Appendix J, Table J.IA., Specialized Preservation Code “GX” and shall be packed into a reusable fast pack container. Items scheduled for domestic shipment for immediate use or short-term storage shall be to level “B” requirements and shall be packed into a reusable fast pack container.

b. Marking for shipment and storage shall be in accordance with MIL-STD-129.

c. The Marine Corps will provide the Contractor with the shipping address(es) for delivery of the rebuilt equipment. The Contractor shall be responsible for arranging for shipment to the pre-designated site(s). The Marine Corps will be responsible for transportation costs associated with shipping the subject equipment to and from the Contractor.

3.3 Configuration Control. The Contractor shall apply configuration control procedures to established configuration baseline items. The Contractor shall not implement configuration changes to an item's documented performance or design characteristics without prior written authorization. If it is necessary to temporarily depart from the authorized configuration, the Contractor shall prepare and submit a Request for Deviation. MIL-HDBK-61 and ANSI/EIA-649 provide guidance for preparing this configuration control document.

3.4 Government Furnished Equipment (GFE)/Government Furnished Materiel (GFM). The Management Control Activity (MCA/Code 573-2) will coordinate GFE/GFM requests and maintain a central control system on all government owned assets in the Contractor's possession. The MCA will forward a GFE Accountability Agreement to the contractor for signature on an annual basis to establish a chain of custody and identify property responsibilities for Marine Corps assets. The Contractor is to acknowledge receipt of GFM to the MCA within 15 days of receipt. 3.5 Quality Assurances Provisions. The Contractor shall provide and maintain a Quality System that, as a minimum, adheres to the requirements of ANSI/ISO/ASQC Q9001-2000, Quality Management Systems - Requirements.

3.6 Electrostatic Discharge (ESD) Control Program. The Contractor shall establish, implement and document an ESD control program following the guidelines provided in JESD625-A. ESD protective measures shall be used during manufacturing, handling, inspection, testing, marking, packaging, storing and transporting ESD sensitive components.

3.7 Contractor Furnished Materiel (CFM). The Contractor may requisition materiel as required in the performance of the SOW through the DoD Supply System. DoD 4000.25-1-M (MILSTRIP) Chapter 11 provides guidance to contractors on the requisitioning process. The Contractor's decision to utilize CFM procured from the DoD Supply System shall be based upon cost effectiveness, availability of materiel and the required completion/delivery date.
